Our Learning

3-6H Earthquake Experiment / STEM Challenge

On Monday, students in 3-6H completed a science experiment to discover how structures such as houses and sheds can withstand forces that earthquakes create. Students used toothpicks and blue tack to create 3D structures, containers of set jelly to simulate the Earth and our arms shaking the container to simulate an earthquake.

Throughout this process, students had to alter their building designs to provide more strength or study how their structure stood up to such powerful shaking forces. A big thank you to parents for making our jelly last weekend. Your help and assistance is greatly appreciated.
