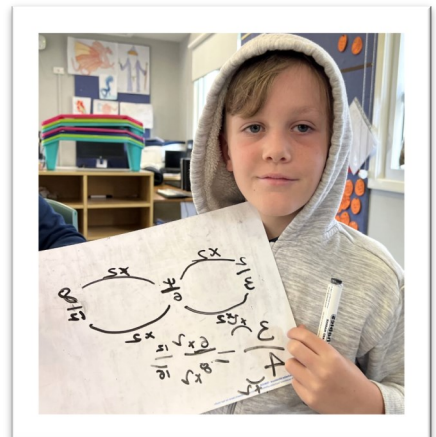
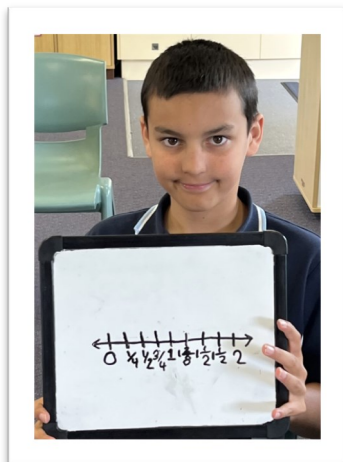
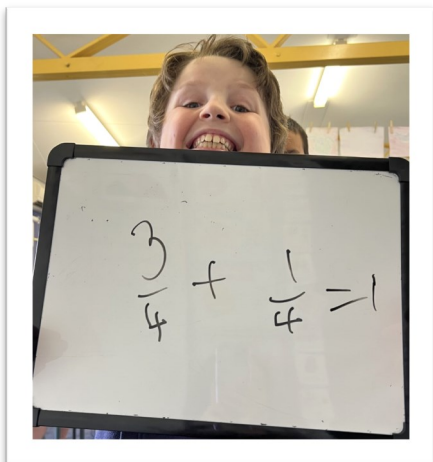
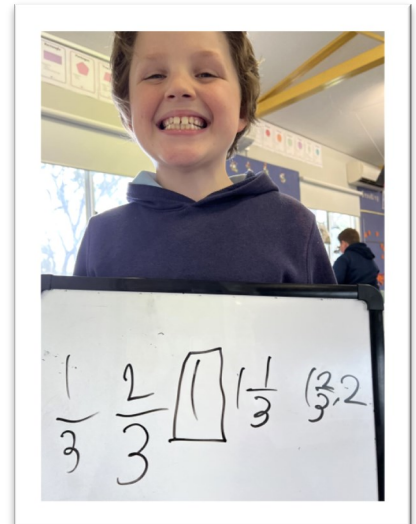
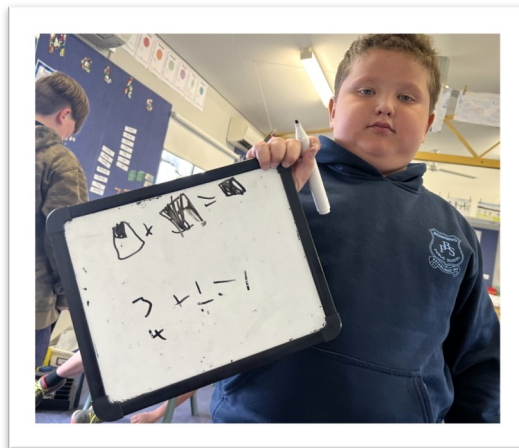
3-6 Learning

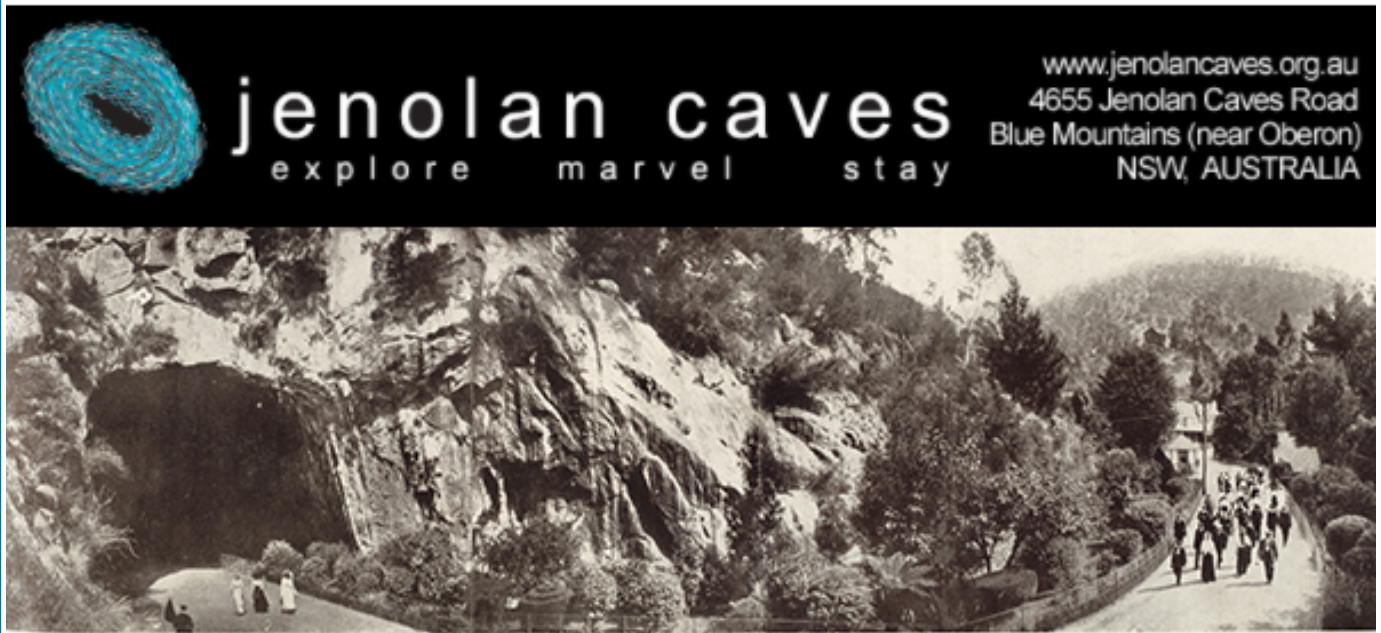
